Community Profile

Granville Christian Academy is located in the village of Granville, Ohio, 30 miles east of Columbus. 3200 residents, over 8,000 residents combined in village and township, make up the population. Founded in 1805 by Christian pioneers from Connecticut and Massachusetts, Granville is a quaint college town that is home to Denison University. Small shops and businesses, restaurants, and museums grace the tree covered streets of the family oriented community. Granville is nestled next to the cities of Newark, Heath, and Pataskala, which together house over 125,000 residents in Licking County.

School

Granville Christian Academy (GCA) serves students in grades K through 12. GCA is a college preparatory school with a four year comprehensive high school program. Granville Christian Academy is chartered by the State of Ohio and is a member of the Association of Christian Schools International [ACSI](http://www.acsi.org). In 2007 the school was recognized as one of the "Top 100" businesses in Ohio. GCA is a member of the Ohio Association for College Admission Counseling and the College Board.

Faculty

18 full and part-time teachers are highly qualified for their positions and make up the Granville Christian Academy high school faculty. 100% have a Bachelor's degree, while 50% have a Master's degree. Their combined years of teaching equal over 160 years of experience.

Enrollment

Granville Christian Academy has an enrollment of 264 students, with a total of 85 students in the high school grades 9 through 12.

Graduation Requirements

The Granville Christian Academy class of 2011 is required to fulfill a minimum of 24 credits for high school graduation. These credits include 4 units of English; 3 units of Mathematics; 3 units of Social Studies (which include American History and Government); 3 units of Science (which include Life Science, Physical Science, and Chemistry); 2 units of Foreign Language; 4 units of Bible; 1 unit of Technology or Fine Arts; ½ unit of Physical Education; ½ unit of Health; and 3 elective units.

Ranking

Granville Christian Academy provides a challenging and intense curriculum for all students. Due to the competitive nature of the students and their course work, the high school does not rank student Grade Point Averages.

Special Programs

Honors coursework is available for Granville Christian Academy high school students in the areas of English; Biology; Chemistry; Algebra I and II; and Geometry. Advanced Placement Calculus is also offered at the high school. Physics and Anatomy & Physiology are equally as challenging as AP courses. All science courses include lab work. Honors and AP courses require a very high level of participation and course work and are therefore graded on a 5.33 grading scale for the class of 2011. These same Honors and AP courses are graded on a 5.0 grading scale for the class of 2012 and beyond. All 5.33 and 5.0 courses are weighted courses.

Granville Christian Academy students also participate in the Post Secondary Enrollment Options Program (PSEOP). Students in this program take courses at the Ohio State University Newark campus for college credit while still in high school.

Students are strongly encouraged to participate in College Level Examination Program testing (CLEP) to earn college credit and begin courses in college at a higher level.

Achievement Testing

Granville Christian Academy high school students are required to participate in the Ohio Graduation Test (OGT). GCA sophomore students have had a 100% passing rate 3 of the last 5 years averaging 94% passing rate for the last 5 years combined.

For 2008 GCA was ranked by Gerber Analytics LLC in the top 10 academic Ohio High Schools based on the percentage of students scoring proficient and above on all 5 parts of the OGT. High school students also participate in the PSAT test; the PLAN; and the EXPLORE test.

College Entrance

All Granville Christian Academy high school students are required to take the SAT and/or ACT College Entrance Exams. The average SAT score for the last 3 years has been 1600 while the average ACT score has been 24.1.

Post High School

All Granville Christian Academy high school students are required to apply to a minimum of 1 college. An average of 97% of all graduating seniors move on to a 4-year college or university. Of that 97%, 90% complete their degree.
